Privacy Policy

1. Definitions and Interpretation

In this Policy the following terms shall have the following meanings:

A system of classifying the different types of cookies used on the Website, or which may be used by third parties through our websites was developed by the International Chamber of Commerce UK and explains more about which cookies are used, why they are used, and the functionality you will lose if the user decides not to want to have them on their device.

What is a cookie?

Cookies are text files containing small amounts of information which are downloaded to a user's personal computer, mobile or other device when they visit a website. Cookies are then sent back to the originating website on each subsequent visit, or to another website that recognises that cookie. Cookies are useful because they allow a website to recognise a user's device.

How long are cookies stored for?

Persistent cookies – these cookies remain on a user's device for the period of time specified in the cookie. They are activated each time that the user visits the website that created that particular cookie.

Session cookies – these cookies allow website operators to link the actions of a user during a browser session. A browser session starts when a user opens the browser window and finishes when they close the browser window. Session cookies are created temporarily. Once you close the browser, all session cookies are deleted.

Cookies do lots of different jobs, such as letting users navigate between pages efficiently, remembering preferences, and generally improving the user experience.

Cookies used on the Website

A list of the cookies used on the Website, by category, is set out below.

Strictly necessary cookies

These cookies enable services you have specifically asked for. These cookies are essential in order to enable you to move around the Website and use its features, such as accessing secure areas of the website.

Performance cookies

These cookies collect anonymous information on the pages visited. By using the Website, the user agrees that these cookies can be placed on their device.

These cookies collect information about how visitors use the website, for instance which pages visitors go to most often, and if they get error messages from web pages. These cookies don't collect information that identifies a visitor. All information these cookies collect is aggregated and therefore anonymous. It is only used to improve how the website works.

Functionality cookies

These cookies remember choices made to improve user's experience. By using the website, the User agrees that these types of cookies can be placed on your device.

These cookies allow the website to remember choices made (such as your user name, language or the region you are in) and provide enhanced, more personal features. These cookies can also be used to remember changes made to text size, fonts and other parts of web pages that can be customised. They may also be used to provide services asked for such as watching a video or commenting on a blog. The information these cookies collect may be anonymised and they cannot track browsing activity on other websites.

Third party cookies

These cookies allow third parties to track the success of their application or customise the application. Because of how cookies work they cannot be accessed, nor can the third parties access the data in cookies used on the site.

For example, if you choose to 'share' content through Twitter or other social networks you might be sent cookies from these websites. This website cannot control the setting of these cookies, so please check those websites for more information about their cookies and how to manage them.
